

MENS CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP 2025 – Rules and conditions of play

The Mount Si Men's Club Championship is a 36-hole (18 holes Saturday July 12th and 18 holes Sunday, July 13th) medal play competition. Play will be according to USGA rules, the local rules on the back of the scorecard and this rules sheet.

The player with the lowest gross score for the two days shall be declared the club champion, regardless of the flight he plays in. Once the overall champion has been determined winners and runners-up shall be determined based on the gross scores of the competitors within each flight, except for the last flight, in which the winner and runner-up will be determined by the net scores of the competitors.

After 36 holes, if there is a first-place tie for the overall club championship, a sudden death playoff will be held to determine the outcome. The playoff shall take place beginning at the 1st hole, as soon as practicable for Pro Shop to arrange. For all other ties not affecting the overall club championship, they will remain as ties and payouts will be adjusted accordingly.

- All flights will play from the Blue Tee Markers.
- Play Summer Rules.

- Please turn your scorecard into the pro shop when finished with your round of golf.

- **Your score will be posted for you.**

- Ground under repair areas will be defined by white lines and (or) signs. If an area is not marked, then you should play the ball as it lies. If an area is questionable, please play two balls and get a ruling from the committee when you are done. It is impossible to mark every spot on the golf course and for the most part, if an area is not marked it will not be entitled to relief unless rare exception to the rule.
 - (Ground Under Repair is a "Free Relief" situation if you decide not to play from the area. You take complete relief with your stance and one club length from there.)

- The use of Lasers or Measuring devices of any sort are ok to use in any Men's Club event as approved by the board.

- Elk Fence around the perimeter of the golf course is played as a lateral hazard.
 - If a golf ball is in play (not inside the hazard) and the fence interferes with your swing, you may play the fence as an immovable obstruction taking a free drop.
